
Pure Massing

The building is treated as two textured masses – a public lower mass and a private upper mass. Both volumes emerge from a solid north-eastern spine, from which movement (carving and sliding) exposes the rough aging corten. The massing of the building aims to create engaging moments that coincide with the movement of pedestrians in the neighbouring context. The carving of the building also serves to incorporate the Leslie House, the heritage building located across the lane, into the newly created Pacific Street streetscape.

Façade Treatment

The building's façade gives the effect of an animated pixilated beacon that entices the public. The skin consists of a game of narrow vertical panels of translucent glass, transparent glass, and white metal panels, creating the illusion of a textured façade. The design of the façade allows for optimal diffuse light in the interior spaces.
