Synopsis

Available information for Long Lake is limited to the 1996 lake survey and a small amount of correspondence. The fishery of the lake is dominated by several introduced (authorized and unauthorized) species of bass. Rainbow trout stocking has been done periodically since 1987 to diversify the fishery, apparently with limited uptake by anglers.

Beginning in 2015, splake have been stocked. Angler interest and success has apparently been much better than it has been for rainbow trout. The future of rainbow trout stocking hasn't been decided at this time.
